Article 246 of the Constitution

246. (1) Notwithstanding anything in clauses (2) and (3), <u>Parliament has exclusive power to make laws</u> with respect to any of the matters enumerated in <u>List I in the Seventh Schedule (in this Constitution</u> referred to as the "Union List").

Seventh Schedule – List I : 18. Adulteration of foodstuffs and other goods.

Rules

Sec 3(1) (zj) of the Act :

(zj) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made by the Central Government or the State Government, as the case may be under this Act

91. Power of Central Government to make rules.
(1) The Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

Regulations

Sec 3(1) (zt) of the Act:

(zt) "specified by regulations" means specified by regulations made by the Food Authority;

Parliamentary involvement

93. Laying of rules and regulations before Parliament.

Every rule and every regulation made under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of Parliament, while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in making any modification in the rule or regulation or both Houses agree that the rule or regulation should not be made, the rule or regulation shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be; so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule or regulation.

What GSR means :

General Statutory Rules

SRO and SO and FN

SRO = Statutory Rules and Orders

SO = Statutory Order

• FN = File Number

Notification

F. No. 1-1275/FSSAI/Import/2015.—The following draft of certain regulations further to amend the Food Safety and Standards (Food Import) Regulations, 2018, which the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India, with the previous approval of the Central Government, proposes to make, in exercise of powers conferred by clause (e) of sub-section (2) of section 92 of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, (34 of 2006) is hereby published as required by sub-section (1) of section 92 of the said Act, for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is hereby given that the said draft regulations will be taken into consideration after the expiry of a period of thirty days from the date on which copies of the Official Gazette in the public: which this notification is published are made available to Objections and suggestions, if any, may be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer, Food Safety and Standards Authority of India, Food and Drug Administration Bhawan, Kotla Road, New Delhi – 110002, or may be sent through e-mail at <u>regulation@fssai.gov.in</u>; The objections or suggestions which may be received from any person with respect to said draft regulations, before the expiry of the period so specified above, <u>will be</u> considered by the Food Authority.

DIRECTION

• Sec 16(5) of the Act provides for Directions :

"(5) The Food Authority may from time to time give such directions, on matters relating to food safety and standards, to the Commissioner of Food Safety, who shall be <u>bound by</u> such directions while exercising his powers under this Act;"
