 - Amendments passed virtually permanent
- Not about regulations ... but about regulatory processes
- Not company specific
 - Except products under Sec. 22

The FA may ... give such directions on matters relating to food safety and standards.. to the Commissioner of Food Safety, who shall be bound by such directions while exercising his powers under this Act

18(2)d

Ensure open and transparent public consultationduring preparation, evaluation and revision of regulations, except

- Urgency concerning food safety or public health ... consultation may be dispensed with And
- Such regulations shall not be in force more than 6 months.
